CURRENT RESEARCH INTERESTS

My research program attempts to understand the processes involved in the sexual victimization and revictimization of women by using a social information processing model (SIP) as a general framework and methods borrowed from cognitive science. The SIP model posits that women at risk for sexual victimization may experience difficulties in one or more of the following areas: (a) interpreting risk-relevant stimuli in the environment, (b) generating or selecting risk-reducing responses to high-risk dating and

social situations, or (c) executing successfully the chosen responses to these situations. As a result of these difficulties, women at risk for victimization may be more likely to respond ineffectively to interpersonal situations in which they are at risk for being sexually victimized. My research focuses on testing each stage of the SIP model. The information derived from these studies ultimately will be used to inform my work in the development and evaluation of interventions aimed at preventing the sexual victimization of women.

CURRENT CLINICAL INTERESTS

My clinical interests include the use of empirically supported treatments to treat anxiety disorders. I am currently the Director of the Anxiety Disorders Specialty Clinic at the University of New Mexico, where I train doctoral students in how to use ESTs for anxiety disorders. I have been trained extensively in exposure-based treatments for PTSD with adults, children, and combat veterans. I also have been trained in briefer forms of manualized cognitive-behavioral treatments for obsessive-compulsive disorder, panic disorder, and social anxiety disorder. Finally, I have been trained in Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), an empirically supported treatment for Borderline Personality Disorder.
