CURRENT RESEARCH INTERESTS

My research program investigates cognitive and behavioral factors that increase women's risk for sexual victimization. Specifically, I use a Social Information Processing

Model (SIP) and methods borrowed from cognitive science to examine women's ability to detect and respond to risky situations, as well as to explore whether aspects of alcohol use (i.e., intoxication, alcohol problems, and alcohol expectancies) influence these processes. I plan to use the information derived from these basic studies to inform my work in the development and evaluation of interventions aimed at preventing sexual violence among women.

CURRENT CLINICAL INTERESTS

My clinical interests include the use of empirically supported treatments to treat anxiety disorders. I am currently the Director of the Anxiety Disorders Specialty Clinic at the University of New Mexico, where I train doctoral students in how to use ESTs for anxiety disorders. I have been trained extensively in exposure-based treatments for PTSD with adults, children, and combat veterans. I also have been trained in briefer forms of manualized cognitive-behavioral treatments for obsessive-compulsive disorder, panic disorder, generalized anxiety disorder, and social anxiety disorder. Finally, I have been trained in Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), an empirically supported treatment for Borderline Personality Disorder.
