

Bachelor of Science – BS Psychology Major Curriculum Checklist

The requirements for a Psychology Major are described below and in the UNM Catalog.

To complete a major in psychology, students must complete 35 credits in psychology with a grade of “C” or better (grades of C- are not accepted) as outlined below; 18 credits MUST be taken at UNM to satisfy the residency requirement. Major requirements are only one small portion of your undergraduate degree.

To Earn the BS Degree students *must declare a minor or 2nd major in a science field*. Choose from the following subjects: Anthropology (Evolutionary or Human Biology concentration only); Astrophysics; Biochemistry; Biology; Chemistry; Computer Science; Earth and Planetary Sciences; Environmental Science; Forensic Anthropology; Forensic Sciences; Mathematics; Physics; or Statistics.

To verify that you are meeting all degree requirements, review your Lobo Trax Degree Audit each semester (via Lobo Web) and meet with your academic advisor to discuss all degree requirements. It is also encouraged that you meet with your minor or 2nd major advisor to review the requirements of the subject you choose.

PSYC 499 Policy

PSYC 499 is an undergraduate problems course. This course is sometimes taken by students that work on research projects with graduate students or a Faculty member in Psychology. Students may take 1-3 credit hours of PSYC 499 per a semester and may take **no more than six (6) credit hours total**. **INSTRUCTOR PERMISSION REQUIRED TO REGISTER IN PSYC 499.**

PSYC 499 as a Lab Course Policy

Students sometimes take PSYC 499 to satisfy an upper level psychology lab. This is a special arrangement made between a student and Psychology Faculty member. **Advance written approval is required (see: UNDERGRADUATE PSYC 499 PETITION)**. Students must meet criteria covered in a regularly offered psychology lab course (i.e., training in methodology, running subjects, analyzing data, and writing up results, etc.).

In addition, the student must write an APA formatted paper covering an experiment during that semester in which the student played an active role (it cannot be a review paper). The faculty sponsor must agree to read and grade the paper and provide the department with the graded copy for their files.

Distributed Minor Policy

Distributed minors must be approved **in advance** by the Associate Chair for Undergraduate Programs. See department advisor for current policies.
